

Endodontic treatment

Endodontic treatment is necessary when the pulp, the soft tissue inside the root canal, becomes inflamed or infected.

What are the signs and symptoms?

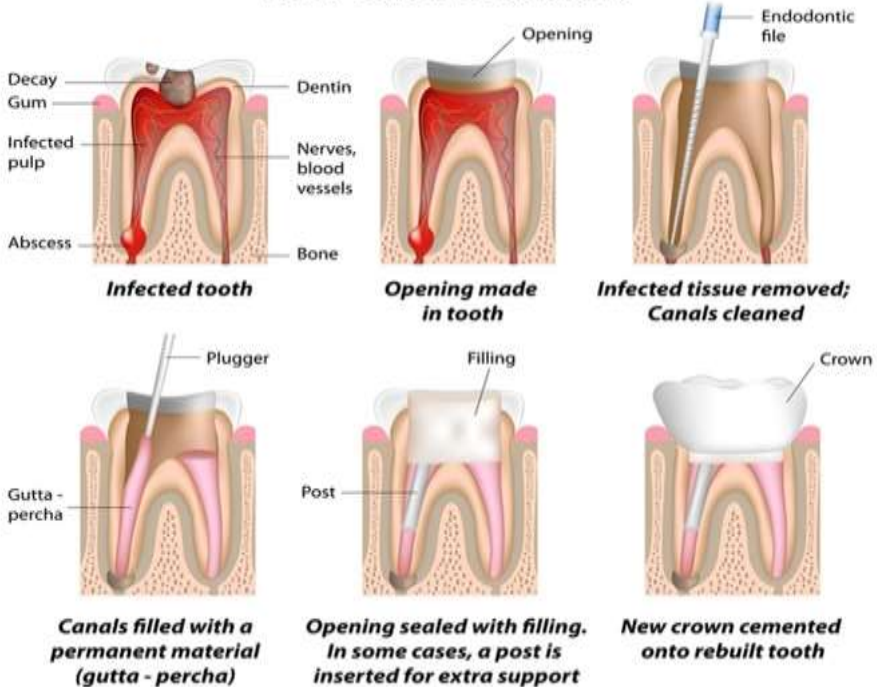
Common signs or symptoms may include:

- Severe pain while chewing or biting.
- Pimples on the gums.
- Prolonged sensitivity to hot or cold, even after the sensation has been removed
- Discoloured tooth
- Swollen or tender gums
- Deep Cavity
- A chipped or cracked tooth
- Sometimes there are no symptoms but can be identified by your dentist following
- Clinical and radiographic examinations
- Pain when you lie down to sleep

How is it done?

Under isolation with a rubber dam the root canals thorough the crown, they are then treated, cleaned and filled with special filling materials and sealed. In order to add more support a post may be added.

Why should I crown my tooth after root canal therapy?

The remaining tooth structure after completing the Root Canal Therapy is weaker than before and needs to be protected, Crowns are mostly done only for the posterior dentition and crowning is considered a part of the root canal treatment.

How long does it take?

Completion of a root canal usually requires a single visit, however in some special circumstances it may require 2 visits or more.
