

## **Cast Care**



**Urgent Care Department** 

Casts are made up of a bandage and a hard covering (usually plaster of Paris). Casts allow broken bones to heal by holding them in place, and usually need to stay on for 4 and 12 weeks.

- Once your cast has been applied you will be given an appointment to attend the orthopaedic specialist clinic. Make sure you confirm this appointment at the reception desk.
- 2. Remember to collect any prescribed medications from the Pharmacy and take as directed.
- 3. The cast/back slab is important; it was applied to help healing and reduce pain.
- 4. The cast/back slab might need <u>up to 24 hours</u> to dry <u>completely.</u>
- In the case of upper limb cast, you may need to use an arm sling to elevate the affected part, this will help reduce swelling, reduce pain, and prevent complications.



- 6. Do not put heavy weight on the cast/back slab and do not pull out the padding cotton from your cast.
- 7. Do not poke or stick anything sharp (sticks, ruler etc.) into the cast to relieve itching as this can cause injury.
- 8. Do not put any lotions or powders under the cast as this may cause a skin irritation.
- 9. Keep the cast/back slab completely dry all the time.

 Never attempt to remove the cast/back slab yourself.



## Go immediately to the hospital in case any of the following happens:

- Severe pain that is getting worse and does not go away after taking the prescribed pain medications
- ✓ Tingling sensation, numbness or weakness in the affected part and difficulty in moving affected body part
- ✓ Discoloration of the fingers or nails
- ✓ If the cast/back slab is broken, damaged, or becomes very loose or wet
- Discoloration of the cast/back slab with bad smell
- ✓ The cast/back slab becomes too tight or painful despite limb elevation and medication usage



If you note a considerable swelling or visible muscle bulging to skin area adjacent to cast, then seek immediate care.
